Bosse Glides Into Council, Gold Likely To Defeat Krasne

Planning Commission Chair Lili Bosse glided to victory in the Beverly Hills City Council election race on Tuesday, winning all 10 voting precincts and collecting 42.3 percent of the votes in the three candidate race.

The second councilmember position could be decided as early as 10 a.m. today. Just 76 votes separated Recreation and Parks Commissioner Julian Gold (2445 votes) and incumbent Nancy Krasne (2369 votes) at end of counting on Tuesday. However, a total of 203 provisional ballots and 281 vote-by-mail ballots were turned in on Tuesday, which left a total of 484 ballots uncounted on Election Night.

City Clerk Byron Pope started a verification process on Wednesday to determine how many of these 484 ballots were eligible to be counted in the City Council Chambers today starting at 10 a.m. The official result could be announced to-

day or even next week, depending on when all ballot verifications are complete or if a full re-count is requested.

Bosse thanked her supporters during a speech at her Election Night party. "The first big thank you I have to give is to my husband Jon," Bosse said. "I'm the luckiest woman in the world. Not only did he wear

orange to every event we had, but he has been the biggest supporter of me from day one."

Bosse described her Election Night as "the most incredible moment that I feel like I'm out of body, I don't even know where I am."

"I love you all and I thank you and I promise you I will give you my heart as I you have

given me yours," she said.

Dr. Gold said he looked forward to the final result. "I am overwhelmed and humbled by the support I received from

our Community," Gold said. "Serving on our City Council would be a great honor and I look forward to seeing the final election results on Friday."
